WEST BASIN MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT invites 4th-5th grade students and teachers to participate in **Splash Science**, a free hands-on water education program that would like to visit your classroom!

Splash Science accommodates 90-100 students per visit and provides a 2^{1/2} hour journey discovering California's water supply. Each participating class visits three action-packed stations: a multimedia game experience called California Water Jeopardy, a full class/full body food chain race, and a live marine animal and plant greeting with a traveling tidepool van.

This traveling school program is made possible through a partnership between the West Basin Municipal Water District and S.E.A. Lab, a program of the Los Angeles Conservation Corps.

Splash Science is correlated to many of the fourth through fifth grade State standards for social science and science. By participating in this free program, students learn to appreciate California's water as a scarce and valuable resource.
