Community Task Force Development

The Community Task Force (CTF) will serve as an advisory body to the County Board of Supervisors, staff of the County of Los Angeles and the Flood Control District in the formulation of a stormwater property-related fee proposal for submission to the property owners in the Flood Control District. CTF members will be influential leaders who are trusted and respected for their opinions and actions, and have a strong interest in improving water quality. They will work together to review data and concepts from the Project Team, various advisory groups and other stakeholders, to develop recommendations that lead to the successful implementation of the fee.

CTF objectives are:

- To the extent possible, reach a consensus on Water Quality Improvement Project, the fee structure, revenue programs, projects, ballot, fee, revenue administration, public oversight and governance.
- Develop strategies for ongoing stakeholder and community outreach.

Criteria for selection to the CTF include:

- Influential leaders in business, environmental, community and civic organizations
- Strong interest in water quality and improving the environmental quality of LA County
- Bring name recognition and credibility
- Executive level representation
- Ability to commit time to the CTF

CTF members represent cities, environmental and business groups, and community members who have a stake in improving water quality.

- Primary Members are those who strongly meet all the criteria of the CTF, chosen to ensure good geographic and community of interest representation, who have actively worked on this issue previously and who the team believes will add significant value to the effort of developing a consensus-based water quality funding initiative.
- Alternate Members are those who also meet the criteria and can be considered if additional members are needed.
