West Basin Awards Eight \$1,000 Scholarships

In an effort to recognize and nurture student interest in water careers, reward scholastic achievement and community service, the West Basin Municipal Water District Board of Directors has awarded eight local students with \$1,000 each in scholarship funds.

"This scholarship program is timely and helpful in these challenging times," said West Basin Board President Edward C. Little. "Tuition is on the rise and the application process is becoming more and more

competitive, but this is also a time when the water industry is expecting many of its professionals to be retiring over the next 5 years."

This is West Basin's first-ever scholarship program. It is open to high school seniors living within West Basin's service area who have been accepted for admission as full-time students to a trade school, junior college, or university,

and have an interest in the water industry. The \$1,000 scholarship may be used for tuition or books.

The eight local students receiving West Basin scholarships include:

- Victor Diaz from Inglewood High School in Inglewood
- Shelah Minor from Inglewood High School in Inglewood
- Makoto Schroeder from Palos Verdes Peninsula High School in Rancho Palos Verdes
- Ellen Bruno from Mira Costa High School in Manhattan Beach
- Kelsey Umemoto from Mira Costa High School in Manhattan Beach
- Kylie Langlois from El Segundo High School in El Segundo
- Andrea Flores from Lawndale High School in Lawndale
- Tony Tran from Hawthorne Math and Science Academy in Hawthorne

"These are exemplary young people who have worked hard and demonstrated great writing skills and an enthusiasm for learning about water," said Board Vice President Gloria D. Gray. "They are our young water ambassadors."

Students are required to have a minimum 3.5 grade point average and write a 500 word essay describing their knowledge, understanding, and appreciation of current and future water issues, describe how water will be integrated into their field of study and the reason they would like to work in the water industry. Students' extracurricular activities, part-time employment, and SAT or ACT scores are also considered.

Universities that will benefit from this young talent include Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, Georgetown, University of California Los Angeles, University of California Riverside, University of California San Diego, and University of California Santa Barbara.
