In today's news, California could [tap the energy](#) stored in wood, garbage, plants and animal waste to fuel a job creation engine that could pull the state out of its economic doldrums, biomass energy advocates said Tuesday. So far, though, the engine has barely crept out of the station.

More than 80 years after San Jose's Guadalupe River was rerouted and separated from its natural connection with San Francisco Bay, a project that aims to [reconnect the bay and the river](#) near Alviso will break ground this morning. Scientists say the project is a key step in the effort to restore 15,100 acres of former salt-evaporation ponds back to tidal marshes.

And Collinsville Area Recreation District crews are hoping a county grant will help them [shore up a dam](#) that gave way late last year, dumping hundreds of gallons from a lake and decreasing its depth by at least two feet.

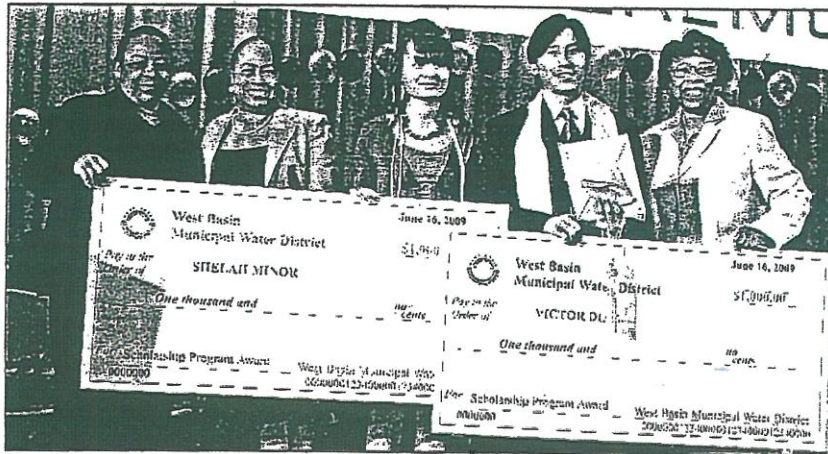

This program is open to graduating high school seniors living in or attending a school within the West Basin service area and have been accepted into a trade school, junior college, or university. The program aims to
