CONSENT CALENDAR

RECYCLED WATER CUSTOMER DEVELOPMENT PROJECT UPDATE

SUMMARY:

This Board memorandum provides the monthly update on the progress of West Basin Municipal Water District's (West Basin) pursuit of recycled water customers.

Aerospace Corporation – Building D8 (5 AFY): The irrigation system to Aerospace Building D8 was connected to the recycled water system on September 1. In order to connect this site to the recycled water system, the Aerospace Corporation paid for the construction of the recycled water service supply line.

Pier Avenue Medians, City of Hermosa Beach (2 AFY): Department of Public Health (DPH) has been inspecting the new irrigation system installed along Pier Avenue. The irrigation system is scheduled to be connected to the recycled water system this month.

CalTrans 405 and Hillcrest (10 AFY): Staff is working with CalTrans to connect a new irrigation system located along the northbound 405 freeway from Arbor Vitae Street to Manchester Boulevard. The irrigation system is scheduled to be connected to the recycled water system this month.

Manhattan Village Estates (30 AFY): DPH is currently reviewing the retrofit design for this site. They have requested cross-connection testing within the site. Staff is working with representatives from the Manhattan Village Estates to implement the testing.

West Torrance High, Victor Elementary, and Anza Elementary School (40 AFY): Staff is working with the Torrance Unified School District (TUSD) to develop new irrigation system designs for these three schools. The designs will be completed and submitted to the TUSD this month.

Customer Service

Manhattan Beach Marriott Golf Course (50 AFY): Manhattan Beach Marriott was connected to the recycled water system in June 2009. Before connecting the site to recycled water, staff provided the Marriott with a soil management plan to keep the golf course turf healthy. Now that the course has used recycled water for over a year, staff hired a turf and soil expert to review the turf condition. A report was developed with a summary of recommendations for Marriott to implement to help keep the course turf healthy.

Goal 1: Water Reliability – West Basin is committed to innovative planning and investments to provide water supply reliability and drought protection.
