Every year, West Basin encourages 3rd through 12th grade students to tap into their artistic creativity by participating in the Water is Life Student Art Contest that celebrates Save Our Water Month, which is in May. Through the contest, students were encouraged to depict wise uses of water at home and in their communities in recognition that conservation is a California way of life.

The art contest is a collaborative water education program between West Basin and the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California. Winning artwork will advance to Metropolitan's regional competition to potentially be featured in the agency's 2020 calendar.
