WATER RECYCLING PLANT EXPANSION CONTINUES - PHASE V CONSTRUCTION ON SCHEDULE

Little Water Recycling Facility in El Segundo currently processes 30 million gallons a day of treated sewer water into usable, recycled water for its customers and is expanding its production capacity and creating efficiencies in operations. The current expansion will improve the water purification process and expand the amount of water purified to more than forty million gallons a day.
