Free water education community festival will return online this fall

CARSON, Calif. –West Basin Municipal Water District announced that its 22nd annual Water Harvest community festival will return in an online format on Saturday, October 23, 2021 at 10 A.M. This free, one-day, family-friendly event will be an opportunity for participants to engage virtually with water experts and learn about local water issues.
