## **WEST BASIN AND THE WATER REPLENISHMENT DISTRICT CELEBRATE EARTH MONTH WITH WATER INDUSTRY CAREERS PANEL**

**CARSON, Calif.** – West Basin Municipal District (West Basin) and the Water Replenishment District (WRD) are teaming up to present the [2022 Water Industry Careers Guest Panel](#), featuring a video library spotlighting two career pathways in the water industry. The program will culminate with a live panel online discussion on April 29, in which high school students will have the opportunity to learn and ask questions about career paths, training programs, and other job opportunities in science, technology, engineering, art and math (STEAM) fields, with a special focus on jobs in the water industry.

The live interactive panel will be held on Friday, April 29, 2022 from 10:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. via Zoom. Featured panelists will speak to students about careers in water resources engineering and government affairs. Panelists will also share their experience working at West Basin and WRD.
