### Water Recycling Facility Field Trips

Students visit the Edward C. Little Water Recycling Facility in El Segundo where they learn about West Basin's water recycling process. Bus transportation is provided.



### Art Contest

The Being Water Wise Is... student art contest helps foster awareness of water conservation. Students are challenged to create artwork promoting water efficient practices and encourage communities to protect our limited water resources.



### A Drop in the Bucket Assembly Program

Classes will participate in a fun-filled school assembly exploring Southern California's water resources and practical water conservation methods.

Students will volunteer to monitor the water quality in the Santa Monica Bay by collecting and processing water samples.
